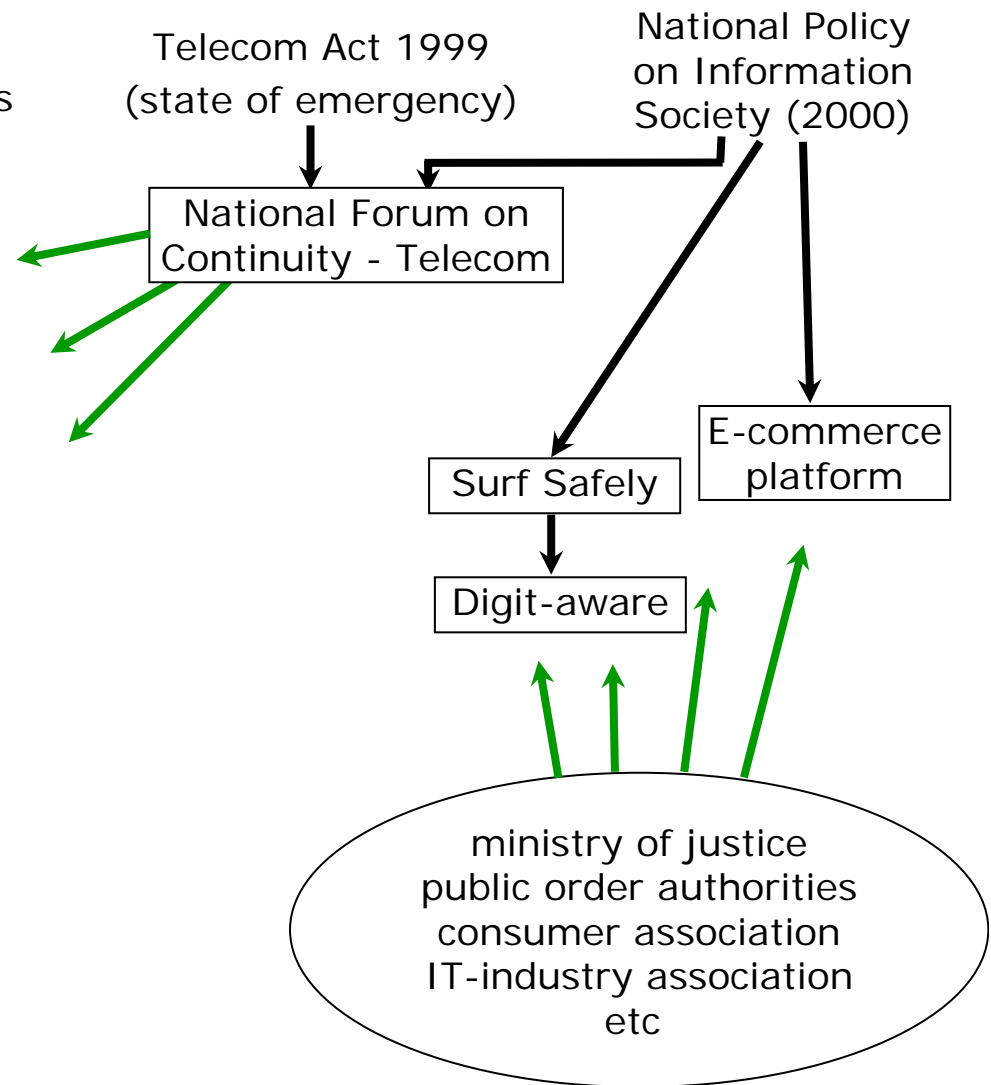
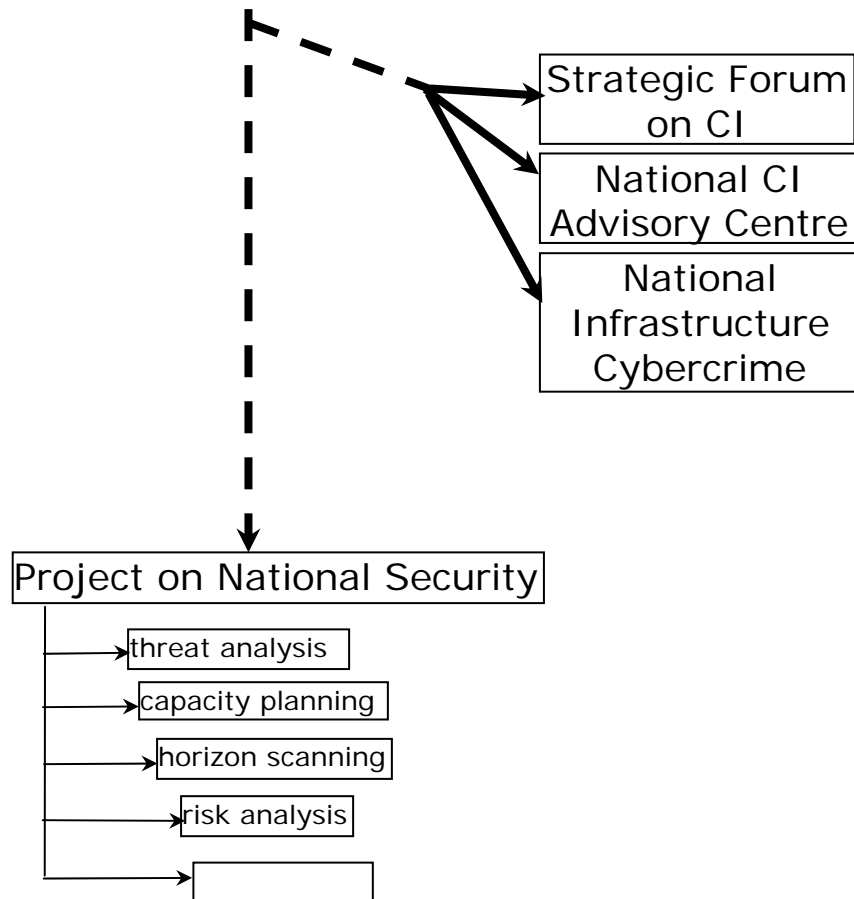

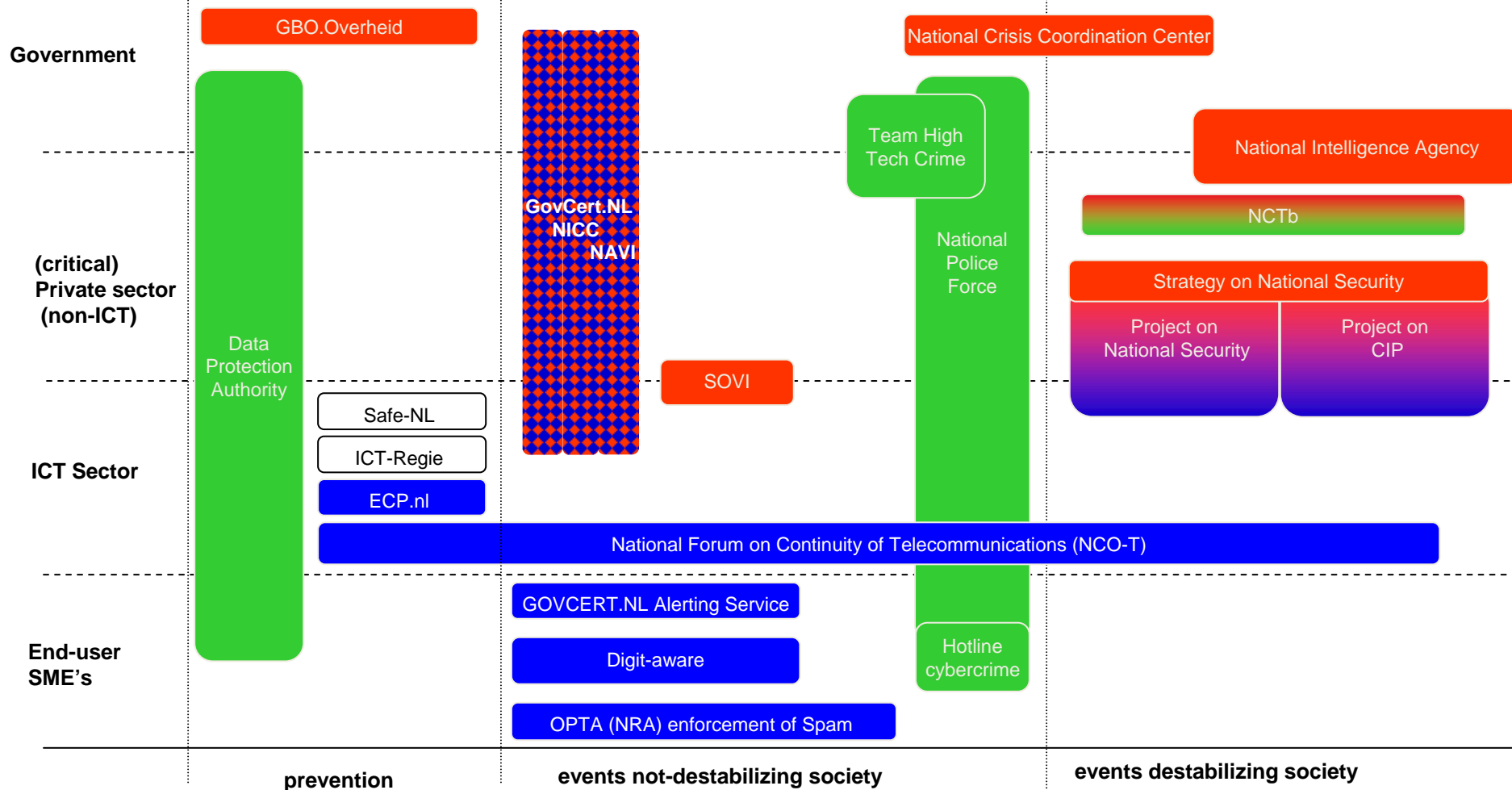


Parliamentary decision (2001):

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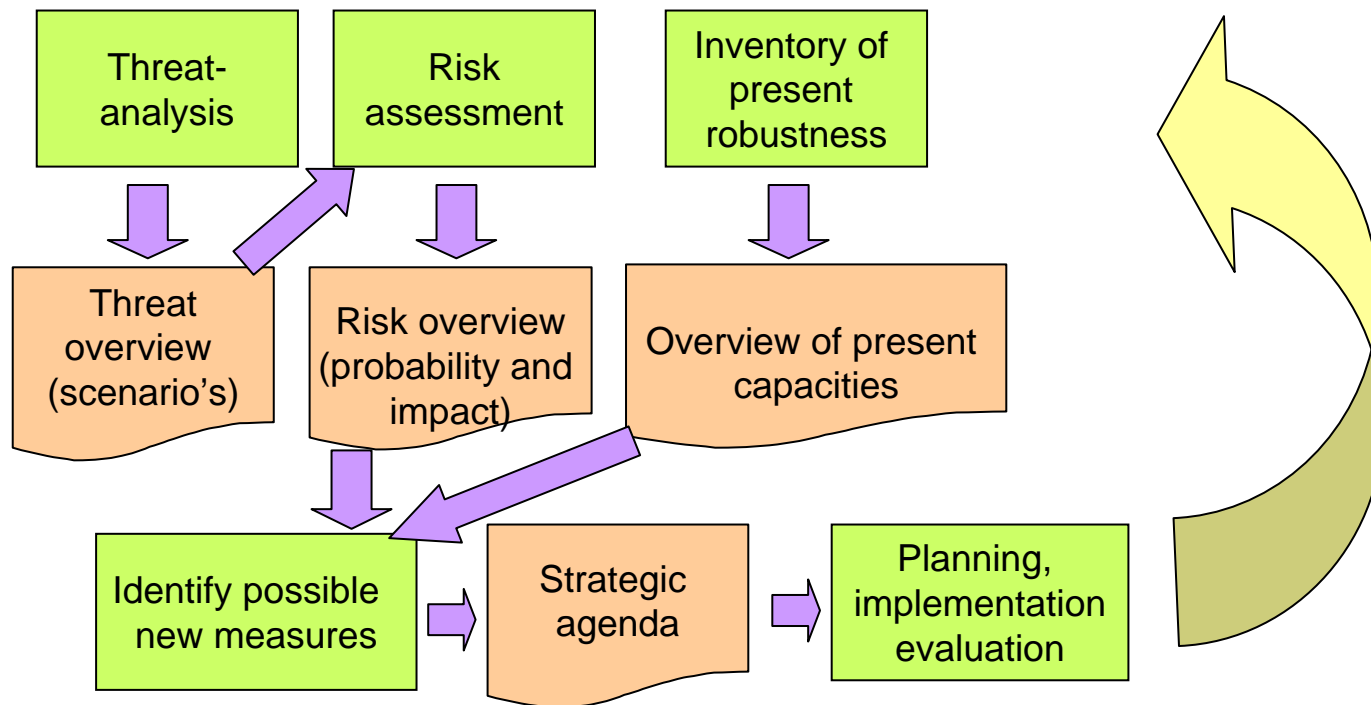

National Security

Structured approach, addressing critical infrastructure





National Security

Scope:

(Potential) disruption of society
prevention → pro-action → response

Issues.....

- based on threats on national level
- realistic scenarios
- nothing is critical beforehand
- protective measures already exist
- extra measures? only when useful
- accept remaining risks
-



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National Forum on Continuity – Telecom (2001)

Agreement:

- fixed/mobile public operators and Ministry of Economic Affairs
- develop measures to prevent disturbances
to respond should one occur
- period of two years

Issues:

- Participation on equal basis
- Mandate needed at workgroup level to decide on deliverables
- Independent chairman / advisor (but: funded from state budget)



National Forum on Continuity – Telecom (2001)

Work together on implementing legal obligations

Building of trust

- shared information will not be misused

Confidentiality of operator specific information

- CP analysis & processes
- CM procedures & preparations
- Knowledge, best practices

Expertise on CP, CM, vulnerabilities, etc. available to ministry

Key issue: support at management level of provider



National Forum on Continuity – Telecom (2005)

From voluntary basis to legal basis to mandatory membership
voluntary participation, but: decisions are binding

Ministry operates chairmanship, secretariat and logistics

Periodically review criteria to designate members

- a. Critical services
(user groups, impact, “usage”)
- b. Providers of critical services
(market share, in control of infrastructure)



NCO-T issues

- From obligations to operational activities
- Identify critical services and “critical” providers
- Method on mandatory report
- Incident alert 24/7
- Meet mutual interests
- Use existing activities / documents
- Expertise: with providers

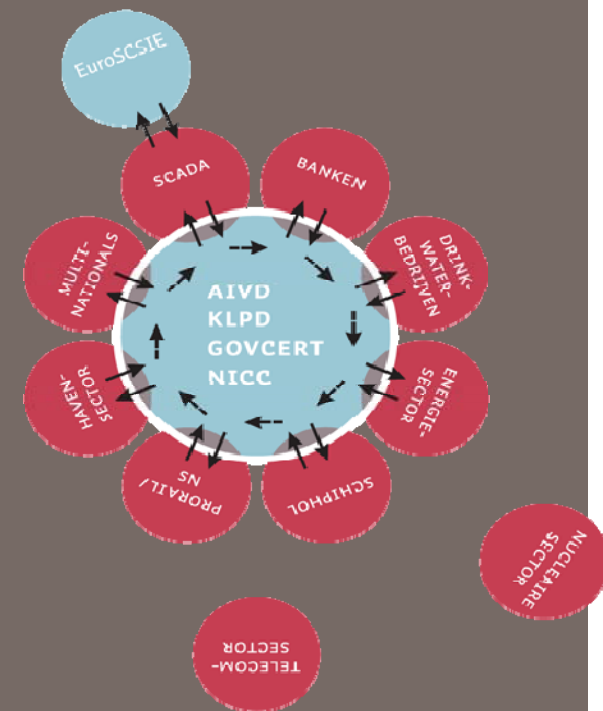

Cybercrime Information Exchange

- Partners
 - private sectors
 - NICC kernel: police, GovCERT, security and intelligence services
- Representatives
 - typically security managers, CISOs, CSOs, members of corporate CIRT
- (Critical) sector takes chair position
- Cross-sector themes
 - e.g. MiFare, Process Control Systems





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PPP issues

How to activate the private sector without financial donations?

How to raise awareness of citizens without a real time threat?

Risk communications

Balance between private and public interests

Some risk should be accepted



PPP issues

Who will bear costs of possible measures?
...and who will get benefits?

Balance between responsibility of private and of public

When is time right to go to international level

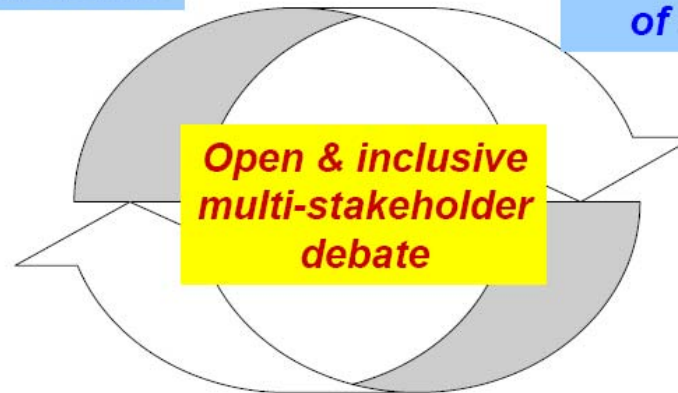
