National Trade Association Network DIGITALEUROPE

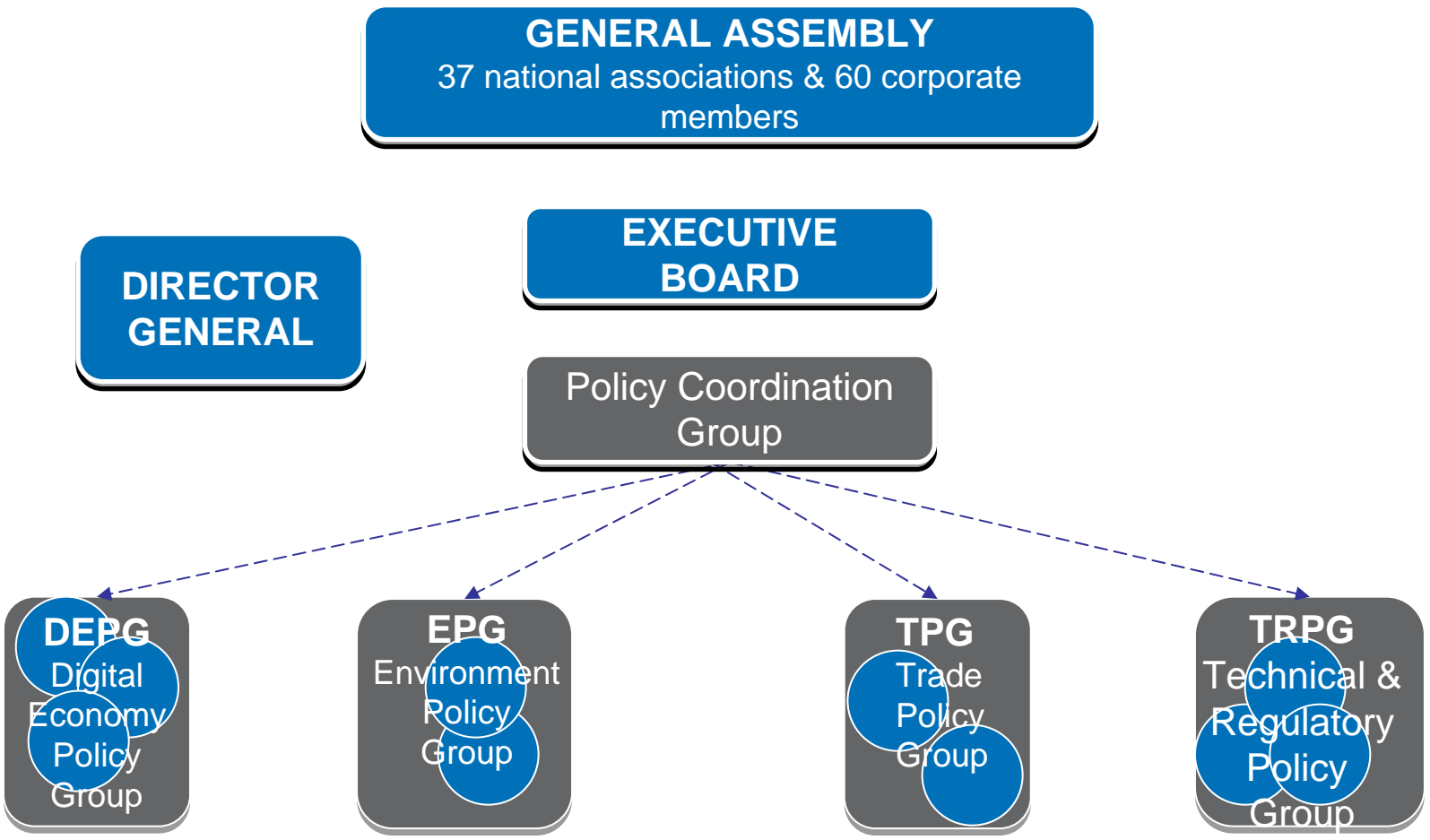


- DIGITALEUROPE NTAs are active in 40 Countries in the EU

- SMEs a key constituency



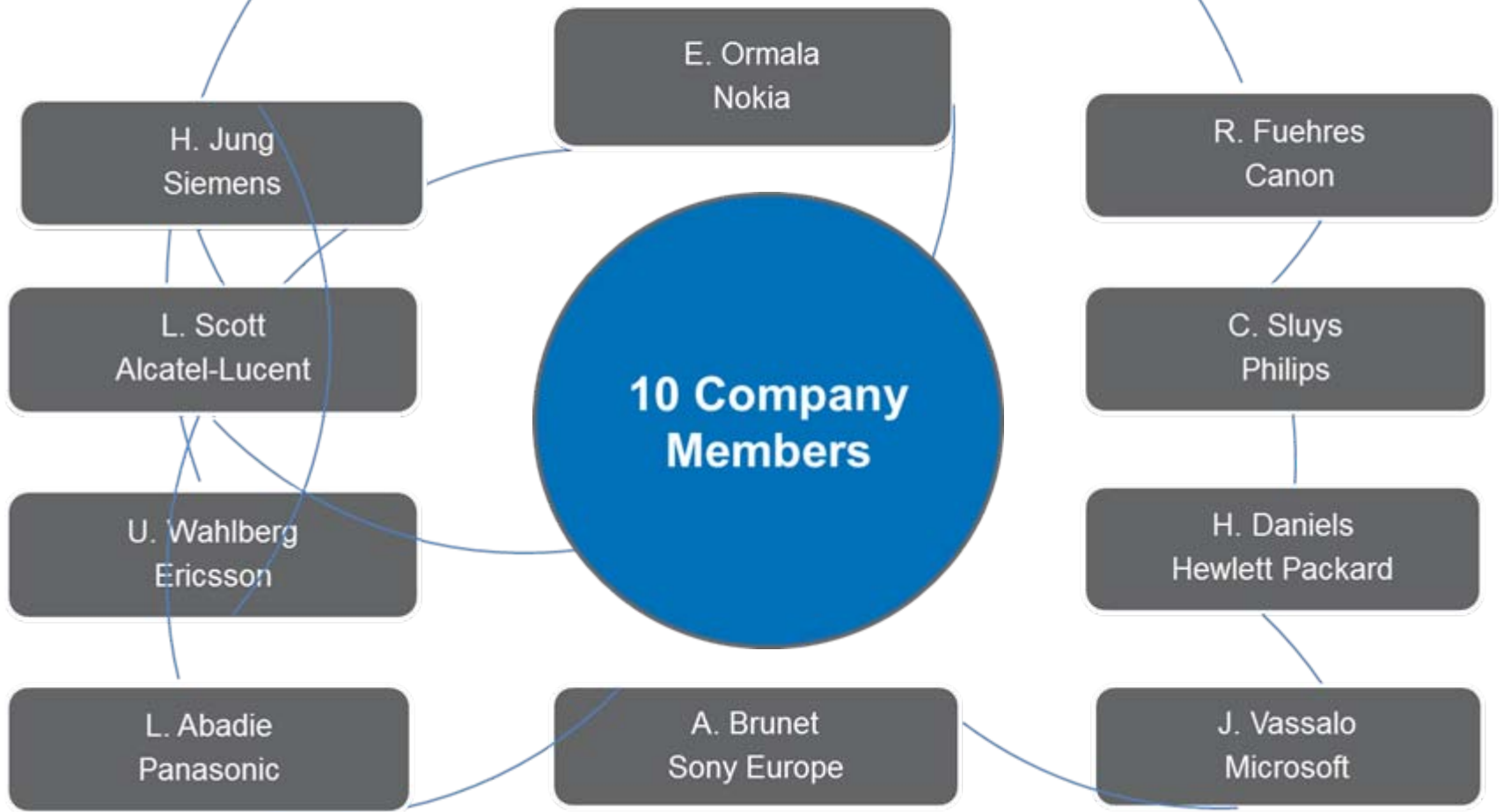
Operational Structure

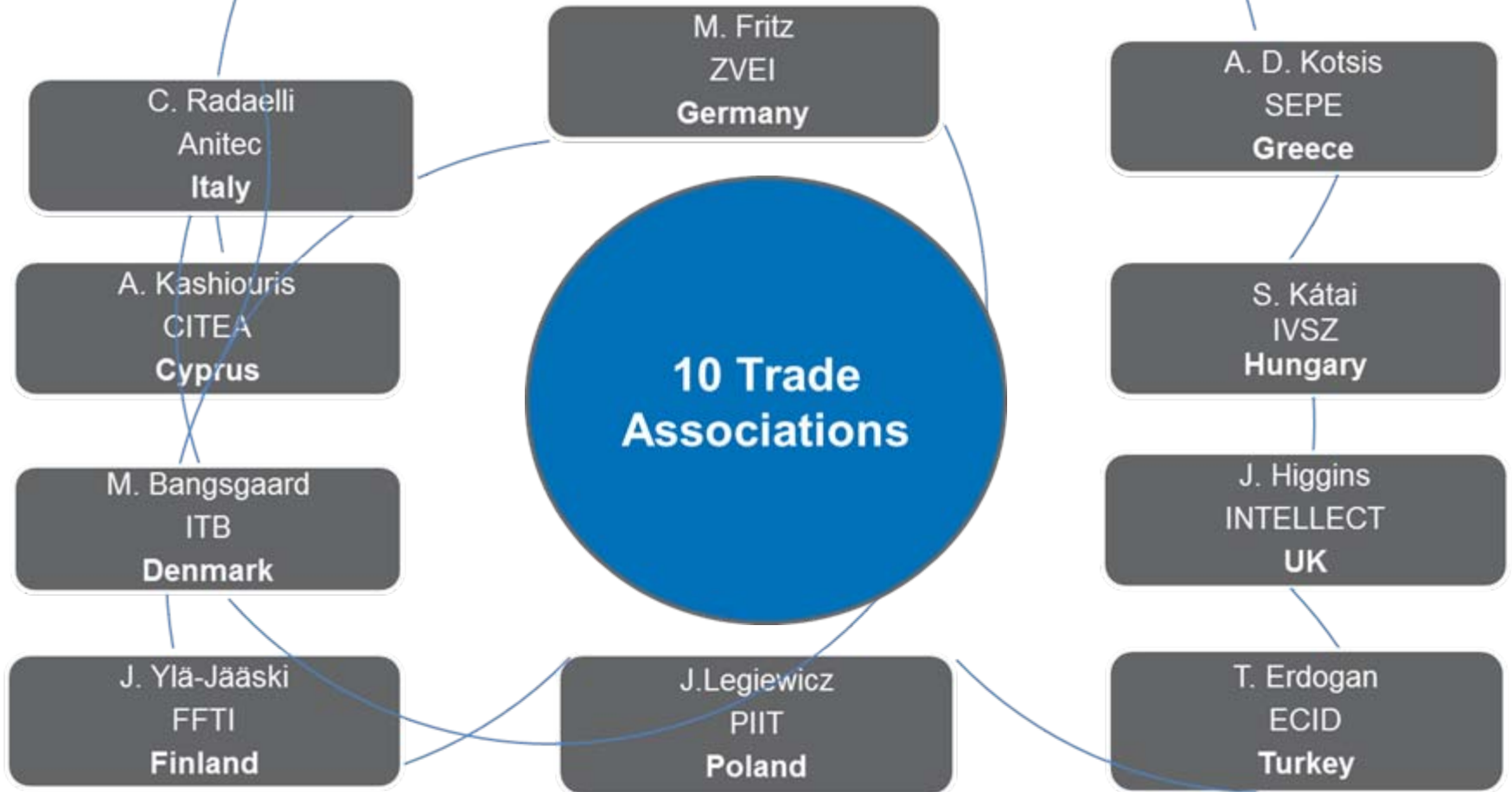

New ENISA Mandate

- Modernised by EU legislation
- EU – US Working Group on Cyber Security and Cyber Crime
- Four Priorities:
 - Cyber Incident Management
 - PPPs
 - Awareness Raising
 - Cybercrime

Global Aspects of Cyber Security



- Interoperable Legal Frameworks
- EU/US Cybercrime Working Group is a Good Foundation
- Key Goals Should Be NOT Just EU/US but Best Practice - Evangelise to Other Countries



- Meeting 20 June 2011: Cyber Security related Market Access Issues (US Mission to the EU and the European Commission - Trade, Info, Enterprise)
- Particular focus on China / India Market Access
- Progress underway with India – through bilateral negotiations and less so with China
